- \cap = Direction that nose faces
- \rightarrow = Direction of movement

(Directions are given in words for some diagonals, curves, etc., if my PC doesn't have the appropriate symbols)

 $\begin{array}{lll} b = behind & br. = brush \\ cl. = close & f = in front \\ L.o.D. = line of dance & sim. = similarly \\ q = quick & R slip-step = R q, L q, R. \\ s = side (steps) or slow (rhythm), e.g. sR s = sidestep right (slow) \end{array}$

x = cross (steps) x 2 = twice (....) x 3 = do steps within brackets 3 times.

Commas are used solely to separate the steps. Semicolons are sometimes used instead of commas to separate sections, or bars, of the dance.
